Our Story

Thirteen years ago I was a couple of months old, stray, alone, skin and bones, starving on the reservation. Jana's Auntie found me and took me in. Her Auntie is still rescuing dogs.

Jana adopted me. Fed me, and soothed me through my fears of thunder and lightning.



I'm still very afraid of thunder - the sounds hurt me inside and I bolt.

During one of the recent storms, I was outside when the thunder started and I bolted. Right out of the yard. Jana got scared. I could feel it. I love her, and we are connected, but I was lost again, wandering the streets. A big truck came, and I got caught. I spent a night in doggy jail. She called SJAL's hotline and they sent Jana to the shelter where I was hoping beyond hope she'd find me. She did.

She gets my vaccinations at the San Juan Animal League clinics, but she never had what she calls a mi-cro-chip put under my skin. What is that? A tiny piece of wood? Under my skin? Ouch! I don't want splinters!

I'm here on this page because, Jana, my best friend asked where to send a donation. A nice SJAL lady came to hear my story and explained about the microchip and that I'd never be lost again. I'm getting one at the next clinic.

Special thanks go to our **Past President Melissa Salyers**, who stepped into the role of President of the San Juan Animal League with grace and fortitude, and whose gentle guidance kept us on topic. She stepped into this role at the sudden passing of Joel Farrell when no one else would or could. *Thank you, Melissa, for your continuing support to SJAL and your undying love of animals in our community.*





Kristen Langenfeld, political activist and long-time supporter of San Juan Animal League, spoke to us about New Mexico's House of Representatives Bill HB123—the creation of a first-ever state low-cost spay/neuter program in New Mexico sponsored by Rep. Carl Trujillo. HB 123 passed the House of Representatives 50-17 on 2/13/17. On 3/7/17 this bill passed Senate Public Affairs Committee 6-2. Unfortunately the bill died in the Senate Finance Committee.
